

Holy Trinity Anglican Church, Parish of Hammond River, provides a small, friendly and welcoming environment. The church and hall are wheelchair accessible.

- Music and fellowship are integral parts of our weekly services with coffee time held after each service in the church hall. The last Sunday of each month individuals are encouraged to bring non-perishable food items for our monthly contribution to the Kennebecasis Valley Food Bank.
- We have a dedicated group of Anglican Church Women (ACW) who carry out craft and bake sales, the proceeds from which are used for mission projects.
- We also have volunteers who prepare and deliver meals to shut-ins and Romero House as well as provide a "Community Lunch" and help with movie nights, yard sales and other events.
- The Guild of St. Joseph is a men's group who meet monthly for fellowship and talks on a variety of subjects and provide support as needed.
- Holy Trinity Hammond River maintains a cemetery on the Stock Farm Road for the use of our church families.
- A Parish Nurse provides a variety of programs and services.

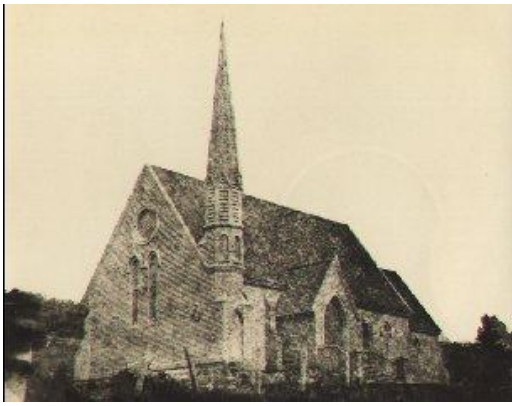

HISTORY OF HTHR

The Parish of Hammond River was established in 1915, but an Anglican Church called Holy Trinity has been in the area since 1863, with the first service being on January 1st of that year. The original location of the church was half a mile south of the Hammond River Bridge on the main road, and it was part of the Parish of Rothesay. The original Holy Trinity church burned to the ground on May 18, 1920 when a forest fire, started by a spark from a passing locomotive, devastated the area. However, much of the furniture was saved and is in use in the present church. The new church, the current one at the present site, was consecrated on January 31, 1923. In the early 1990's a chapel was added to provide more space. At the same time, the basement was enlarged and a switch was made from furnace to radiant heat. Over the years churches have been added to, and have been separated from, the Parish of Hammond River. Today Holy Trinity Hammond River exists as an incorporated entity in its own right, and the "little white church by the bridge" continues to be a centre for community caring and fellowship.
