ST. LUKE'S ANGLICAN CHURCH OUTREACH MINISTRY: St. Luke's Church in the north end of Saint John offers a variety of programs and services for members of the uptown and north end communities. Throughout the year (with the exception of some time in August when staff take much needed vacations) they run the *Son-Rise Breakfast* and *Loaves and Fishes Lunch* programs and a clothing/small household items depot for those in need. For six weeks in the summer they have a community drop-in for folks in the north end who want to stay connected when other programs in the community close for the summer months. As well as nutritious meals the outreach program at St. Luke's offers hair care, footcare, friendship, and fellowship. There are several ways to support the great work being done at St. Luke's: you can make a financial donation by calling the church office at 693-4152; you can drop off clothing, books or small household items at the church (call to make sure someone is there to receive your donation); you can volunteer at one of their meal programs; you or your church can donate food items for their meal programs (call to find out what they need).
